

# Basic Crash Investigation

**June 7-11, 2010**

## **Course Description:**

This program is designed to teach the fundamental skills necessary to conduct basic on-scene crash investigations and complete all required reports. This program begins with the legal aspects of a crash and concludes with the students doing hands-on field projects. The field projects will require the students to survey the crash scenes and complete scale diagrams. An emphasis is placed on the collection and preservation of evidence.

- ✘ Preservation & Collection of Physical Evidence
