

Basic Evidence Technician School

September 27– October 1, 2010

Course Description:

These 40 hour basic evidence technician courses cover the detection, documentation, preservation and collection of evidence and the submission of this evidence to the Wisconsin State Crime Laboratories.

Course Instructors:

This course will be taught at the State Patrol Academy by Instructors from the Wisconsin State Crime Lab.

Recommended Equipment:

- ✘ SLR camera, 35mm or digital camera \geq 6 mega pixels
- ✘ Electronic flash with guide # \geq 100 and a hot shoe to hot shoe sync chord for off camera use
- ✘ Shutter release cable/ remote
- ✘ Tripod
- ✘ Rechargeable flashlight
- ✘ Camera and flash unit equipment manuals for instructor/ student reference

Please install fresh batteries and have a replacement set of batteries prior to arrival.

35mm film is provided during the training.

Students using digital cameras must have a copy of the image recovery software for the camera being used and a means to download images (card reader or USB cable).
