

Police Shotgun Instructor

June 14-18, 2010

Course Description:

This training program is designed to provide currently certified law enforcement firearms instructors with the additional knowledge and skills necessary to conduct contemporary department level training for the patrol shotgun. Students need to be familiar with the basic knowledge associated with the patrol shotgun and its operation. This program has increased from 24 hours to 32 hours to provide training in the area of less lethal munitions fired from the shotgun (i.e. bean bag rounds).

Topics of Instruction include:

- ✘ Use of Force and Deadly Force Decision Making
- ✘ Weapon Nomenclature
- ✘ Ballistics
- ✘ Weapon Assembly/Disassembly (Care and Cleaning)
- ✘ Weapon Malfunctions
- ✘ Low-light, Night Fire Training
- ✘ Weapon Transition/ Selection
- ✘ Range Officer/Instructor Responsibilities and Exercises (Coach/Student)
- ✘ Less Lethal Munitions and the Shotgun- Effectiveness, Policy and Instruction
