

# Vehicle Contacts Instructor

## August 17-21, 2010

### **Course Description:**

This will be a train-the-trainer program designed to meet the requirements for Vehicle Contacts Instructor certification from the Training and Standards Bureau. The program will follow the LESB training guide.

### **Topics of Instruction include:**

How vehicle contacts training fits into the general unified tactical training approach to law enforcement training, how vehicle contacts training is related to training in other tactical subjects, and is the culmination of information in other tactical subjects.

Review the key DAAT concepts, which are the basis of unified tactical training. These include proper uses for application of physical force, the control process: a disturbance resolution model; the force option continuum; basic concepts regarding the proper use of force; and the first responder philosophy. Familiarize vehicle contacts instructor candidates with the components and contents of the standard training guide for this subject, as well as with the intended uses of the training guide.

Conduct a complete run-through of the vehicle contacts training curriculum, so that instructor candidates are thoroughly familiar with the core concepts and instructional approach to teaching vehicle contacts. Provide vehicle contacts instructor candidates with basic information on effective instruction and evaluation of students in this subject, including both cognitive and physical aspects of the course and review and discussion of scenarios and isolation exercises.

Provide an opportunity for vehicle contacts instructor candidates to ask questions and get clarification on all aspects of instruction on this subject.
